Table 2: The four vowels used in Phatak and Allen (2007) (aka MN64) were /a, xq, i, xi/ as defined by the DOS-ASCII (DOS-bet) filename convention. To reduce the translation confusion, these four MN64 vowels have been colored-coded **cyan** here, and in the table below. The initial ‘x’ in DOS-bet indicates an upper case letter follows, thus these translate to LDC-bet as /a, Q, i, I/. The defined spoken sounds are: [c/o/t, h/a/t, b/ee/, h/i/t], and in IPA they are [a, æ, ɪ, i]. The **cyan** labels are the vowels used in MN64. The **red** is the vowel incorrectly reported by Phatak and Allen (2007), which was really the long /e/ (bet **ε** → beet **i**). Latex (tipa) symbols for all the LDC CVs: $\text{\textipa{A}} \rightarrow \text{a}$.

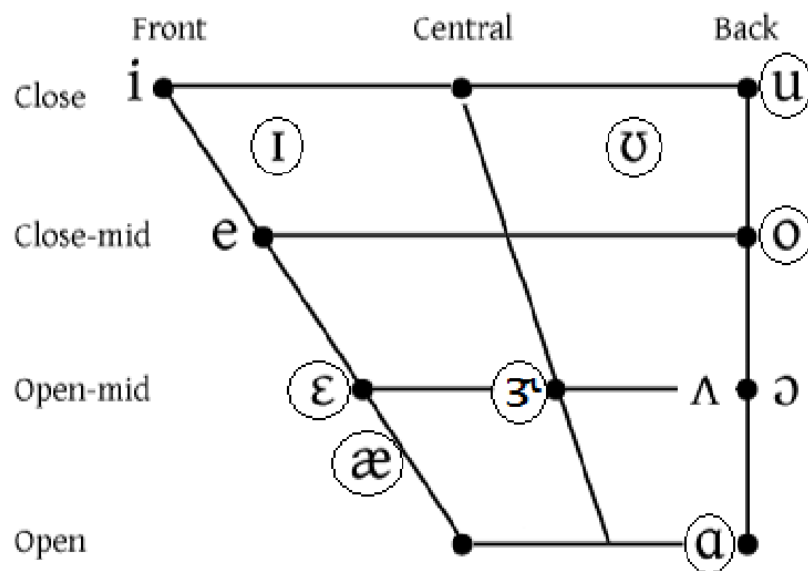


Figure 2: Vowel “triangle.” Circles indicate those used in CV06.

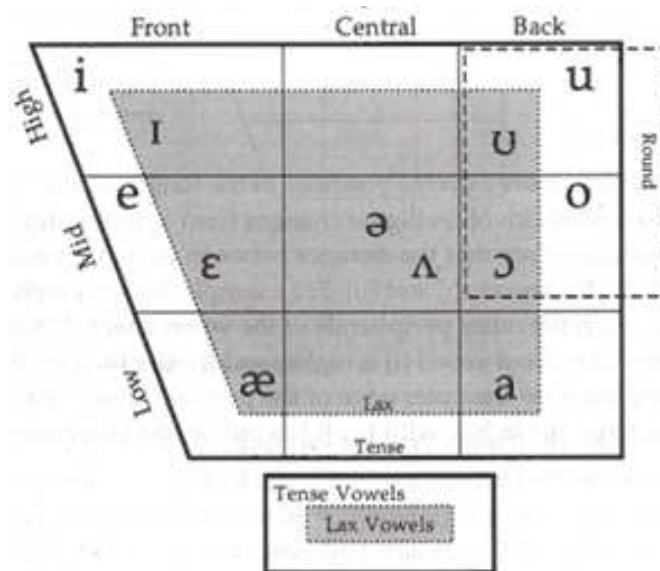


Figure 3: Tense vs. Lax vowels.

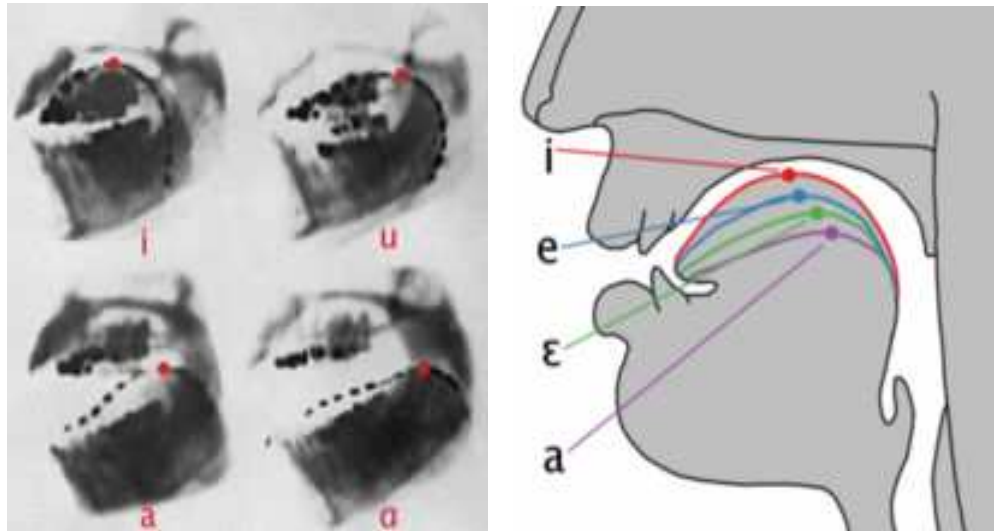


Figure 4: Cardinal vowels of the human vocal tract, xray images. [wikipedia]
